

CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK IN CHINA

Airport Authorities Asked to Step Up Vigil on Travellers

Govt plans guidelines for treatment and prevention of the mysterious virus

New Delhi: The health ministry has alerted airport authorities to keep a strict vigil on travellers in view of the outbreak of a deadly coronavirus in China that has infected at least 650 people and killed 17 so far.

There are 1,200 Indian medical students studying in Wuhan, the epicentre of new virus and many of them are expected to travel to India between January 25 and February 8, as Chinese New Year holiday season begins, officials said.

"Once they (the students) land they will remain under surveillance even if they don't show any symptoms," Sujeet K Singh, director at National Centre for Disease control (NCDC), said.

The Centre is also expected to come up with an exhaustive set of guidelines for treatment, management and prevention of the mysterious virus for the healthcare authorities, officials said.

An Indian national in Saudi Arabia is reported to have tested positive for the virus on Thursday.

To be sure, India began taking precautionary steps by screening travellers at seven international airports and issued a travel advisory for citizens visiting China.

Officials said India is leaving no stone unturned to combat the virus that the World Health Organisation may soon declare "a public health emergency of international concern".

WHO held a meeting on Wednesday but delayed its decision due to a lack of information. It defines a public health emergency of international concern as "an extraordinary event" that constitutes a "public health risk to other states through the international spread of disease" and "potentially require a coordinated international response". Previous emergencies have included



Ebola, Zika and H1N1. "The decision about whether or not to declare a public health emergency of international concern is one I take extremely seriously, and one I am only prepared to make with appropriate consideration of all the evidence," WHO director general Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus had told reporters in Geneva after Wednesday's meeting.

WHO is to gauge the global threat once again on Thursday. Public health experts in India said they are awaiting guidance from WHO.

Meanwhile, measures have been taken to ensure the virus doesn't enter the country. As of now a total of 12,828 passengers from 60 flights have been screened for the virus till January 23 and no cases have been detected, the health and family welfare ministry said.

The ministry has already approached all states and union territories to review their preparedness, identify gaps and strengthen core capacities needed to prepare for, detect, and respond to possible outbreaks, health secretary Preeti Sudan said. "Integrated Disease Surveillance Programme has been issued advisory to all states/UTs to pick up any travel related case reported in the community and follow up contacts of suspect/confirmed cases," she said.

The health ministry has also written to the civil aviation ministry to allow a thermal screening of all passengers arriving in the country from China at airports in Bengaluru, Chennai, Kochi, Delhi, Hyderabad, Mumbai and Kolkata.

PW Engine Woes May Force GoAir to Cancel up to 50 Flights

Mumbai: No-frills carrier GoAir may have to cancel about 50 daily services, including to international destinations such as Singapore and Kuwait, as it continues to face problems with the Pratt & Whitney engines that power its Airbus A320neo planes, said a person aware of the operational challenges. The airline has grounded at least

seven of its 49 planes, said the person. One plane, on an average, makes eight to nine daily domestic flights. In a statement earlier in the day, GoAir said the gap in capacity will continue at least until early March, as there is a delay in the delivery of new planes.

"In the past four weeks, we have gone through unplanned grounding of aircraft, which were supporting our current operation of fleet. And now, we have been infor-

med by our business partners Airbus and Pratt & Whitney of their inability to deliver previously promised aircraft and engines through March 9 that are required to support our current growth," said a statement from the airline.

"As a result, we have been forced to temporarily suspend certain flights that are part of our network, scheduled and open for sale," said a company spokesperson, adding that the suspensions have been undertaken long ahead of the schedule.

GoAir has about 30 Neo aircraft and has ordered a total of 144 planes — all to be powered by the Pratt & Whitney GTF engines. It placed the latest order in November last year. The engines have faced continued

glitches since February 2016, leading to flight disruptions and slowing effective capacity addition. IndiGo and GoAir are two of the world's leading customers for the engines.

In June last year, IndiGo shifted to CFM engines, placing a \$20-billion order for them.

The Directorate General of Civil Aviation, India's aviation regulator, has ordered IndiGo to modify the PW engines that power the airline's aircraft.
